

Subject Pronouns Notes

In English, a subject pronoun replaces a noun that is doing the action of a verb.

For example: Mr. Smith talks to students. Mr. Smith sees them in the hall.
Mr. Smith cares about students. Mr. Smith disciplines students.

In these sentences we can replace "Mr. Smith" with "He" since we know who we are talking about and who is doing the action. "He" is a subject pronoun.

English subject pronouns are:

I, you, he, she, it, we, they

Here are the subject pronouns in Spanish:

IMPORTANTE:

- With plural subject pronouns, remember that if there is one guy in the group, no matter how many women, use the masculine form.
- Some times you will see multiple nouns and subject pronouns together.
 - Any time that "yo" is included, use the nosotros/as form. If you see tú or Ud. Or Uds., and "yo" is not included, use Uds.
 - Ejemplo: *Roberto y yo = Nosotros*
